OTTAWA, Oct. 14-(Special)-Ottawa this afternoon gave a great welcome to Duke of Connaught. Parliament Hill was resplendent in red, white and blue flags, bannerets and bunting. The westher was ideal and an immense crowd

His royal highness arrived by speclai train from Quebec at 2.15, the special having been held at Buckingham in order that the civic arrangements might not be upset. The journey was made by way of the north shore, the train crossing thru Hull and pulling into the Broad-street Station.

A military band at the station played the national anthem as the train came in, while a royal salute was fired from Primrose Hill. The vice-regal party were met by Hon. R. L. Borden and nembers of the Dominion Government.





TO FATHER'S KEEPING Justice Sutherland's Decision Doesn't Fix Costs-More Char-

acter Evidence Given. Mr. Justice Sutherland decided late Suturday afternoon that William J. Strong, who was sued in the assise court by his wife for possession of

their 5-year-old daughter, should retain the child. The matter of costs will be examined into and decided later by the court. It was left for Strong to decide whether or not Mrs. Strong should be allowed to visit her daughter. Evidence as to certain telephone conversations between Mrs. Strong and an east end dentist, with whom it is alleged she was too intimate, was heard at

Saturday's hearing of the case. Roy Strong, brother of the husband could cut from Mrs. Strong's telephone and hear what was said. One morning she called up the dentist, he said, and

asked if she could keep her appointment with him. Reading from his notes, Strong told what had been said. "No, you have no appointment with

me," the dentist answered. "Oh, now, what is the matter with
