AFRIDS HAVE RISEN

And the Mad Mullah is Collecting Forces for an Attack.

FIGHTING IS GOING ON AT ALI MUSJED

And the Situation is Reported to Be Decidedly Serious in India.

What the Government Feared Has Come to Pass--A Lengthened Campaign and Desperate Fighting Expected--Afrids Attack Ali Musjed and Fort Maude--The Enemy Entering Khyber Pass--Rumor That Ali Musjed and Fort Maude Have Fallen Into the Hands of the Enemy--Armenians Are Desperate--President Faure's Grand Reception at St. Petersburg--General News by Cable.

Simla, Aug. 23--A large force of Afrids has just been reported to be advancing down the Khyber Pass, and the so-called Mad Mullah, or fanatical priest, who is leading the natives of that territory against the British, is said to have collected the Mohammedans for an attack upon Michal and Shabkadar.

The Royal Irish Regiment and one of the representative native infantry, with a battery of mountain artillery, have been ordered to Kohat. Fighting is reported to be proceeding at Ali-Musjed between the Afrids and the British garrison at that place.

The Position is Serious. London, Aug. 23--An official despatch from Peshawar announces that the Afrids attacked Ali-Musjed this morning, and adds that they were attacking Fort Maude at 10:30 a.m. today. The Afrids are said to have joined in the uprising. The news contained in this official despatch is most important, as it probably means a protracted campaign and desperate fighting.

Enquiry Being Held on the Body of the Little Boy Long--Eye-Witnesses of the Capsizing of the Raft Tell What They Saw--The Scramble From Death--Jury Views the Scene at McNamee's Cut--An Engineer to Give Expert Evidence--Aldermen Now Claim That They Know Nothing About the Construction of the Treacherous Float, But Say It Was Ald. Lamb's Side-Graft for His Constituents.

The details of Sunday's shocking tragedy at McNamee's Cut were read with sorrow by thousands of people yesterday and Sunday.
