YALE AND HARVARD WRESTLING CAPTURED 6 OF 9 EVENTS

Oxford and Cambridge Athletes Lost the Rubber—Saturday in England.

London, July 23.—Taking first honors in the series of nine events on the card, Yale and Harvard defeated Oxford and Cambridge this afternoon and won the rubber in the athletic contest between the principal universities of America and England, which began in 1870.

In that year at the Queen's Club, Kensington, the Englishmen scored by five events to four. Two years later, in September, 1901, the Americans turned the tables, and at Berkeley Oval, New York, won six events out of nine. Now a combined Yale and Harvard team has duplicated the Berkeley Oval performance.

Although a slight drizzle fell in the course of the afternoon the weather was such that could be desired for an athletic contest. The sun was hidden and the temperature was not too high.

The proceedings passed off with enthusiasm and spectators alike were attracted by the best of good feeling and visitors were congratulated as heartily as at the previous events.

In the evening the teams dined together at the Grosvenor, a chair being taken by Sir Lewis Knowles, Bart., an old Cambridge athlete, who went over to America in 1901. Lord Alverstone, who was a favorite runner for his varsity in his day, sent a telegram regretting his inability to be present.

After dinner silver and bronze medals were presented to the first and second in each of the nine events, the heroes of the day.

Receiving tremendous applause as they came forward to receive their trophies, Yale and Harvard then turned to the wrestling.

By singing "For he's a jolly, good fellow" the Britishers responded to the American song, "The Victrola Song."
