VERY IMPRESSIVE CEREMONY HELD AT VICTORIA HOSPITAL

Unveiling of Tablet in Memory of Victoria Nurses Who Died in War Service.

The unveiling of the bronze tablet at Victoria Hospital yesterday afternoon, in memory of the Victoria nurses who lost their lives in the fight for freedom during the late war, was one of the most impressive ceremonies of its kind ever held in the city. Not a dry eye was left in the large ward on the ground floor of the hospital where the ceremony took place after the final notes of the "last post" were sounded by Bugler Charles Ward of the R. C. R. The final mark of respect was paid when the whole audience, numbering perhaps 100, filed past the beautiful tablet and read the names inscribed thereon: Lieut. Agnes McDougall, Lieut. Henrietta Mellett, Lieut. Katherine MacDonald and Lieut. Dorothy M. Y. Baldwin. The tablet, which is executed in bronze, bears at the top the British coat-of-arms and underneath: "Their names liveth forevermore." It is the gift of Col. William Gartshore to the hospital, and will be placed in the enrance hall of that institution.

Those who were invited to attend the unveiling ceremony were friends of the four nurses whose names appear on the tablet, overseas nursing sisters and other nurses and military people of the city. Col. Wm. Gartshore occupied the chair, stating the purpose of the ceremony. Ceremonies were opened by an invocation offered by the Rev. R. J. Bowen, the final drawing of the fiag from before the tablet being done by Miss Margaret Stanley, lady superintendent of the hospital. A cello solo, played with muted strings by the Rev. G. Q. Warner and "The Supreme Sacrifice," sung by Miss Margery Talbot were also included in the program.

Three splandid addresses referred to the nursing sisters who had sacrificed their lives and their splendid heroism. Col. Seaborn of No. 10 Stationary Hospital, who was the first speaker, declared, "Although I tried to carry out my duty in every posible way, while at the front, I now look back with unutterable remorse, because often when there came appeals for men and more men at the front, I had to send on men who were not fit to be sent. I say this because I want to show the difference between what men did over there and what women did. The nursing sisters, from their experience at the front, cannot possibly feel any remorse." their experience at the front, cannot possibly feel any remorse."

Col. Seaborn spoke of Nursing Sister Agness McDougall, who was with No. 10 hospital for such a long time, and who was then sent on to Etaples crly to be killed by a German bomb coming through the operating-room a few days before she was to return to No. 10. He also mentioned Nursing Sister Katharine MacDonald, who was returned to Canada, to die here.

"We are here today, not only to do honor to the nurses whose lives were lost during the war, but to do honor to lost during the war, but to do honor to all the mothers and sisters and wives throughout the Dominion who gave their support and help during the terrible conflict." he said. In referring to the nurses themselves, he spoke of how the sick men had always spoken of their kindness and care, and how whenever the soldiers wrote home it was always of the nurses that they spoke first.

He told of that terrible day, May 29, when the Etaples Hospital was bombed in spite of the fact that it was Corpus Christi Day, and both armies had promised to desist from hostilities. And in this connection he mentioned the splendid work of Nursing Sister MacDougall and Nursing Sister Baldwin, who were killed by the falling of a German bomb, directed onto the hospital. bottle from your druggist, \$1.00.

He mentioned the burial of the nurses and patients on May 31, and how the French people stripped their gardens to lay flowers on the graves, and were still doing so, for he had heard but a few days ago that the French were still caring for the graves at Etaples.

Nursing Matron McIntosh was the final speaker, telling of Nursing Sister Henrietta Mellett's work in the east, and how she was drowned on a ship returning to Ireland, which was torpedoed.
