The book itself is sufficient proof that Daniel was a prophet and that he himself was the author of it.—Both "Josephus," and Aben Ezra affirm Daniel to be a prophet, the former claiming him to be one of the great prophets; and the latter observing that he delivered out prophecies of things now past and of things to come, which were received, read and believed by the Jews and the Prophets Ezekiel (in c. xiv. 12, 14) makes special reference to him viz. "And the words of the prophet Daniel."
