



That means that the citizens of Toronto have been saved close on half a million dollars. If the civic electrical department is patronized as it should be we will be in a position to make further reductions in our rates. More revenue means cheaper light and power."
The Toronto Electric Light Company's rate for direct current commercial lighting is eight cents per kil-owatt hour for the first 30 hours of the month, and 3 cents per kilowatt hour over that amount. The city's rate is 10 cents per kilowatt hour for the first 30 hours of the month and 4 cents per k:lowatt hour for all over 30 kilowatts. EARTHQUAKE SHOCK IN HUN-
