

debt. The congregations have improved, and the Sabbath School prospers, being conducted by a devoted staff of Teachers. During the year several of the Scholars have been hopefully converted.

WIARTON.—During the year we have had peace within our borders, and prosperity within our palaces. Our congregations have been good, class and prayer meetings moderately well attended. A church has been built at Colpoy's Bay, at a cost of \$500, \$450 of which has been provided for. A church is in course of erection at Oxenden. The Sabbath School department of our work is very encouraging. Bro. Woodman has nobly assisted the Pastor. We report an increase of twenty members. We thank God and take courage.

PALMERSTON.—We are enabled to raise our Ebenezer and exclaim with Samuel, "Hitherto the Lord has helped us." Numerically we stand about the same as last year. Financially we are improving, our Missionary receipts are better than formerly. We expect that during the summer a church will be built in Harriston.

CLINTON.—The Parsonage has been moved to the corner of William and Rattenbury streets, a stone foundation and cellar built, and the expenses provided for. We have a new appointment at Mount Hope, congregation about 70, an eligible lot for a church (deeded to the Connexion) has been presented. A brick church (56 x 38), with basement and end gallery, is in course of erection in Clinton. Monetary depression severely felt, yet by diligent effort, receipts are equal to expenditure. Special Meetings were held at Clinton and Summerhill, with good results. Sabbath School interest is increasing, congregations larger and a good spirit of hearing prevails.

DEREHAM.—During the year we have toiled hard, and have realized some success. Special services were held at Bethel, lukewarm professors were blessedly quickened, backsliders were reclaimed, and many sinners professed to be saved through believing in Jesus.

INGERSOLL.—The past year has been one of hard labor and much anxiety of mind, but we feel thankful to the great head of the church, that we have not labored in vain. The congregations both at Ingersoll and Putnamville have im-
