Arrest of
Trespassers.

Sir,

Respectfully referring
you to my letter of 6th July last,
and, particularly to the "P.S." thereof,
(which letter was acknowledged by you
of the 11th July: - 11,438 -) I think
it proper, now to ask for authority
to cause the arrest and commitment
of one George Brown, who was
removed by the Sheriff in January
last at a cost of £9.84, which
the man was unable to pay, or
secure: In about two months,
it is reported to me - he returned
to the Reserve, renting another
lot from an Indian, where he
now is, reaping his crops.

Brown is not the only case,
but others - here and there - have
returned, but, for the present,
I think, one such example will be
sufficient for the others.

I would myself go with
the Deputy Sheriff, have Brown
arrested,
The Sup^t General
Indian Affairs.

I would prefer committing him, if
he paid the fees and departed from the
Reserve. I have no wish to offend, but
rather spare that course if possible.
