### NEW CREDIT.

The past year has been one of great peace and harmony, and a considerable degree of success. The means of grace have been well attended, and an increasing interest has been manifested in spiritual things. A special meeting was held, which resulted in much good to both Whites and Indians. Several have died, some of whom repented during their sickness, and gave good evidence of a change of heart, and preparation for death.

The use of intoxicating liquor is decreasing very much. We have two temperance lodges on the Mission. The day and Sabbath-schools are well attended. The Missionary contributions are more than fifty per cent. in advance of last year. There is an increased spirit of liberality. Twenty-eight have been received into the church ; nine have been lost by death, &c., leaving an increase of nineteen. Present membership,—Whites, on trial, 2 ; members, 16 ; Indians, on trial, 9 ; members, 59 ; total, 86.
