

SCRAPPED ENGINES REBUILT AND RETURNED TO ROAD

Obsolete old locomotives, relegated years ago to the scrap heap, have been reconstructed by one of the western railways and put in service on some of its branch lines. Some months ago the work was first undertaken, and seven discarded engines rejuvenated. The pressing need for small locomotives at that time, and the proximity of a dull season which otherwise would necessitate the temporary discharge of a large force of shompen, at Lincoln, Neb., were largely responsible for the inauguration of the plan. In addition to tiding the shop force over a dull season, a group of good locomotives was produced at a saving of about one-third the cost of new ones.—From the September Popular Mechanics magazine.
