OTTAWA, Jan. 3.—Immigration to Canada for the eleven months of the calendar year 1926, ended November 30, amounted to 130,569, according to the Department of Immigration and Colonization. This is an increase of 61 per cent over the same period of 1925, when the total immigration was 80,904.
