Worth \$64,000 To Winner This Year

Louisville, May 12.—(Associated Press).—The forty-ninth renewal of the Kentucky Derby already has set records for record, although the race's greatest race is still more than a week away. The nominees, numbered 145, far exceed all previous totals, the nearest approach being the 109 mark of 1920. With a possible 21 starters, the race will be worth \$64,000 in addition to the winner's gold plate valued at \$7,500.

For the first time in its history the Derby will be run on the second Saturday of the meet, instead of the opening day. This change was decided on to avoid conflict with the Preakness, another famous race, at Pimlico, Maryland.

As for the records which may be established by the horses themselves, indications are that one of the most evenly balanced fields in many years will face the barrier on the afternoon of May 3.

The possible \$64,000 purse this year, quite a contrast with that of the first Derby, in 1875, when \$4,500 was offered, has been increased to \$7,500.

Seating arrangements have been made to take care of 30,000 persons. Standing room where the Derby can be seen from terraced steps and promenades can easily take care of 50,000. The others will have to take pot-luck from the field or roofs of adjoining stables and buildings.

The Keene Brothers' Alice Blue Gown has many followers on the strength of her two-year-old record for speed and gameness.

K. Bryson's Betting Sun has come into recent notice by winning the inaugural Handicap at Bowie.

The Montfort and B. B. Jones' Derby entry this year is Dan E. O'Sullivan, black in color and one of the most striking in appearance in the history of the Derby. E. R. Bradley's Blossom Time is another fully given high rating by the experts.

Benjamin Block, owner of Morvich, the 1922 Derby winner, will try to repeat this year with Aspiration and Better Luck. Mr. Block recently purchased Aspiration by George Smith, a Derby winner, out of inspiration.

THIEVES FALL OUT.

Stolen Horses Recovered After Triangular Duel.

Manila, April 20.—(By Mail)—Not long since, at Lunik, in the Sulu archipelago, three enterprising Moros, named Abura, Dambung and Damsang, stole two horses, which they drove to a remote and sparsely inhabited district. The three proceeded to debate upon a just and equitable division of the spoils. Each Moro voted himself one horse and were all killed.

Shortly afterwards a Constabulary patrol came along and recovered the two horses, which were returned to their rightful owners.

PERSHING'S 'SECOND' GIVEN OVATION AT BERLIN OPERA

National Anthem Played in J. I. Anderson's Honor; He Had to Accept.

London, April 2.—(By Mail)—It is not often that one person's resemblance to another leads to such pleasant events as those which have befallen John I. Anderson, an American, who has just returned from a visit to Germany, where his likeness to General Pershing led to an amazing display of pro-German feeling, says a Westminster Gazette correspondent.

Mr. Anderson said he went to the opera house at Berlin with a party of ten others.

"We occupied a box, and as we were arranging our seats the orchestra suddenly struck up with the American national hymn," he said. "I was astounded when I noticed that all eyes were turned in my direction, but it was only when the audience commenced to clap and shout 'Pershing' that I realized what had happened. I naturally had to play the part, and bowed my acknowledgements."

This is not the only occasion, Mr. Anderson says, on which he has been mistaken for the famous general.

Mr. Anderson was a member of the American peace delegation at Paris after the armistice.

FRIEND PICKS HIM BRIDE, HE DECLINES, THEY FIGHT

Grave Dug in Garden Morning After His Marrying Another Proves Last Straw.

London, April 2.—(By Mail)—Hugh McCarron, who was bound over to Lettickenry, County Donegal, for assaulting a man named Dennis Bradley, said that on leaving his home on the morning after his wedding day he found that a grave had been dug in his garden during the night, says the report to "The Westminster Gazette."

The incident followed a dispute in which McCarron had refused to marry the girl chosen for him by his parents, and had married a girl of his own choosing.

The parties later met in the town on the fair day, and there was a stand-up fight, in which revolvers were used.

AIRPLANE POWER HELPED

Improvement of at least 10 per cent. in the lifting efficiency of airplane wings is expected to be made by a young ex-officer of the flying corps.
