Frankfurter's blood became affected, and the transfusion of blood from a healthy person was recognized as the only way of saving his life.

Officers of the regiment, ranging from major down to lieutenant, volunteered to supply the blood, and Lieutenant Dittmar was selected as the first to volunteer.

ARCHDEACON FORSYTH FORTY YEARS AS RECTOR Chatham Commercial—On Sunday, July 7, Ven. Archdeacon Forsyth celebrated the fortieth anniversary of the beginning of his pastorate in the parish of Chatham. This parish, it is said, is unique in the history of the Anglican church in Canada, in that it has had only three rectors, in almost a century.
