PROTEST BY GERMANS.

Objection to Introduction of Danish Coinage in Flensburg.

Copenhagen, May 19.—German journals in Flensburg vigorously protest against the introduction of Danish coinage into the first zone, being evidently extremely anxious over the consequences if Flensburg should be cut off from its natural trade district. The Germans maintain it is unlawful and against the peace treaty while Germany has sovereignty in the first zone, to introduce Danish coinage there, and declares the Flensburg second zone, which has only German paper money and through the southern custom boundary is cut off from Germany, will be exposed to ruin and chaos. A meeting will be held Sunday in Flensburg to decide on steps against the intended change of coinage. Vice-President Adler of Slesvig, who is the soul of the movement, declares a strike will be declared comprising all classes of population, which will completely paralyze the life of the town and country districts. A resolution will be passed demanding that the international commission, as soon as possible, finish its work and leave Flensburg.

POWER SURVEY OF MISSOURI RIVER

Pierre, South Dakota, May 19.—The engineers selected to make a survey of the possibilities of the Missouri river for the purposes of hydro-electric development have made their final report, and show that out of a half dozen places in the big river, the most practical one to meet the present needs of the state is a location near the northern line of the state where a power plant with a thirty-foot head of water can be constructed at a cost of \$3,108,000, and that transmission lines can be constructed at a cost of \$7,044,000, or a total of slightly over \$10,000,000. Such a plan would develop power sufficient to supply the eastern part of the state with electricity at a cost of 1.78 cents per kilowatt hour, which basis, by the disposal of the power possible of development at that point, the return would be sufficient to pay costs of operation and distribution, and in a few years provide either a reimbursement fund to the state for the original investment or to extend the power development of the stream.


