PLEDGE FULL OUTPUT

ON 8-HOUR DAY American Multigraph Work-

ers Secure Shorter Hours on Their Own Guarantee.

Cleveland, May 19—A guarantee that production would continue at the present rate per day was given by the 1,000 employes of the American Multigraph Company here through their "congress" when hours were reduced from nine to eight. The congress is elected by the employes. A committee of the congress worked for a number of weeks going over production methods aimed to speed up the day's work. The report of the congress read in part:

"It was further agreed by the congressional eight-hour committee that if production falls below the present standard congress is willing to concede the return to the nine-hour work-day under the present rate of wage payment.

"The eight-hour day if granted is to be given a thorough trial for a period of at least six months before a change of any kind pertaining to working hours is considered."

This is the second time the employes have recommended and obtained a reduction of hours without a corresponding cut in production. On Oct. 6 last year the hours were reduced from ten to nine but production per man per day remained the same.
