- PLEDGE FULL OUTPUT ON 8-HOUR DAY**
- American Multigraph Workers Secure Shorter Hours on Their Own Guarantee.
- Cleveland, May 19.—A guarantee that production would continue at the present rate per day was given by the 1,000 employees of the American Multigraph Company here through their "congress" when hours were reduced from nine to eight. The congress is elected by the employees. A committee of the congress worked for a number of weeks going over production methods aimed to speed up the day's work. The report of the congress read in part:
- "It was further agreed by the congressional committee that if production falls below the present standard congress is willing to concede the return to the nine-hour work-day under the present rate of wage payment.
- "The eight-hour day if granted is to be given a thorough trial for a period of at least six months before a change of kind pertaining to working hours is considered."
- This is the second time the employees have recommended and obtained a reduction of hours without a corresponding cut in production. On Oct. 6 last year the hours were reduced from ten to nine but production per man per day remained the same.
- MICHIGAN GOVERNOR URGES LOWER WAGES.**
- Detroit, Mich., May 19.—Governor Albert E. Sleeper of Michigan, by a statement that wages in manufacturing plants of the larger cities should be reduced, has brought public interest in the industrial and economic situation to a new high pitch.
- The governor holds that high rents and the high cost of living generally are due to high wages paid by great industries, especially the automobile industry. These high wages, he declared, have caused thousands of men to leave the farms or desert their former employment.
