PRINCIPLES AND PRACTICE OF MEDICINE.

PROFESSOR CAMPBELL.

It is proposed in these lectures to give a complete history of the most important constitutional affections, as well as of the diseases which attack the principal organs of the human body.

The distribution of the Course will have some reference to the different systems of organs, the diseases which will be separately and fully described. Thus, diseases of the respiratory, digestive, nervous organs, etc., will constitute distinct sections of the course, and, again, the different forms of fever, including the acute febrile diseases of specific character, will form a separate group.

PRINCIPLES AND PRACTICE OF SURGERY.

PROFESSORS PERRIGO AND ARMSTRONG.

This course of lectures will include the principles on which the science of Surgery is founded, and also the chief rules for its practice.

It will be divided into two parts,—General and Special.

As heretofore, operations will be performed on the dead body, the different forms of surgical instruments, apparatus, etc., shown, and their uses explained.

Senior Students will have the opportunity of performing operations themselves on the dead subject under the guidance of the Professor.
