PARNELL AND MRS. O'SHEA POLICEMAN SHOOT.

THE WOOD WILL NOW BE THE TALK OF ALL CITIES. New Light Thrown Upon Parnell and the O'Sheas' Lives—How it came that Mrs. O'Shea was charged with Parnell's Murder—Love for Her Son—How she sacrificed his Trust.

London, Oct. 31.—Parnell's death has in no way diminished the interest with which the trial of the Wood case next month is awaited by English society. This curiosity arises not alone from the magnitude of the fortune involved, viz., about \$1,000,000, but because it is expected that the progress of the suit will throw a new light upon Parnell's mysterious life, and possibly reveal evidence in relation to his breach of the Seventh Commandment, on which testimony will be produced, upon which Parnell always confidently relied to clear himself of the moral guilt usually associated with this offence.

It is known in legal circles here that Parnell regarded Mrs. O'Shea's two younger children as his own. In fact, a careful scanning of the statement of O'Shea's conduct in the divorce suit, reveals the fact that at the time a distinction was intended to be made between the children and the eldest child, but that the Court, privately seeing the expediency of all the children, O'Shea draws a handsome allowance for their maintenance from the fortune held in trust for them, and which is now the subject of litigation made out of trust funds, but on condition that O'Shea should reside in Brighton, so that she might visit her children as often as she pleased.

O'Shea was never so well off as he is now. The allowance he drew for the custody of the children is much larger than he herebefore allowed by his wife, when, as O'Shea alleged in the divorce suit, she was living with Parnell at Egham and elsewhere. If Mrs. Parnell chooses to vindicate the character of Parnell in the sense Parnell always meant, she can do through the medium of the suit for the custody of the children, which she has now commenced in London, his wife to Egham, being for and far between.

Family quarrels ensued and finally Miss Wood became so irritated by the conduct of the other parties, that she first and last made another, which left everything she possessed to her children, Mrs. O'Shea, for Mrs. O'Shea's children. This will suit, however, O'Shea's children, as they are now in possession of the fortune until the will is proved.

Among the many disclosures that it contains there is one of the most sensational description, showing that in the bitterness of their animosity over money Mrs. O'Shea's relatives did not hesitate to charge her with the grave crime of forgery. This episode, perhaps the most curious in the whole suit, would never have been permitted to leak out, though the papers in the case have been in the hands of many different lawyers. The information of the world comes from a perfectly authentic source and rests on documentary evidence, which will be produced when the suit comes to trial.
