**Firs News Phoographs of London
Great Street Battle With Anarchists**



Photograph shows "Scots Guards" sharpshooters firing at the windows of the Whitechapel, London, house in which were barricaded the five or six anarchists. The battle took place Tuesday, Jan. 3. Three weeks before the burglary, or anarchists, had killed three policemen who surprised them while robbing a jewelry store. The desperadoes were traced to the Whitechapel slums and on the morning of the battle the police surrounded the house. The burglars opened fire and for hours kept 1500 policemen and a company of Scots Guards at bay, until artillery was brought up and the house shelled from under them. One policeman was killed and several wounded and all the burglars died in their burning fortress. In the picture the sharpshooters and policemen are beyond range of the enemy's revolvers.

**SUFFRAGETTES ACTIVE
AT CABINET MEETING**

London, Jan. 20.—The cabinet held its first meeting today for the purpose of drafting the King's speech from the throne and a programme of legislation for what promises to be an historic session of parliament.

The militant suffragettes thickly dotted Downing street, determined to remind the ministers that their demands were as urgent as ever. One banner suggested that Home Secretary Winston Churchill should be imprisoned. The active young bearer of this conviction, managed to elude the police, rushed the home secretary when he appeared on the street and using the banner as a lance, attempted to knock off Mr. Churchill's hat. The police quickly cleared away the demonstrators.

**SONS OF TEMPERANCE
DIAMOND JUBILEE**

**Strong Statements Made by
Speakers at Newcastle Meeting—
Council Not Doing its
Part—St. John Man Attends**

Newcastle, Jan. 19.—Last night Newcastle Division No. 45, S. of T., celebrated its anniversary, the exact date of which was January 7, 1837. The meeting was held in the hall of the G. W. P., Deputy G. W. P., James Falconer, a member for fifty years of the Division; District Scribe, H. H. Stuart, and Revs. W. J. Dean, H. T. Cousins and S. J. MacArthur addressed the meeting.

The following musical and literary programme was well carried out. Mrs. Dean and Miss Williamson, accompanists, Quartette, Dr. Estey, A. E. Shaw, F. S. Henderson, James Calder, Jr., solo, Mrs. John Walter Miller; duet, Mr. and Miss Calder; reading, P. S. Henderson; solo, Miss Edith McLean; quartette, Estey, Shaw, Henderson, Calder.

Some of the speakers were very pointed in their remarks. Mr. Henegar condemned the liquor traffic as causing 90 per cent of the destitution of the country.

Dr. Cousins said that the liquor trade had not abated here during the year. The present council was worse than the preceding. Some of the councillors had made fair promises which had not materialized. There was lots of material in town for a new council. Businessmen afraid to act for fear of offending someone should not offer for election.

Rev. Mr. MacArthur hoped that the present shame of enforcing the Scotch Act was not one of Newcastle's periodic spasms of reform. He was afraid that the majority of the electors were hopeless of a better condition. But the town had just what it needed for it.

The importation of liquor by individuals should cease. Liquor should be kept for sale only by government vendors, which vendors should, like postmasters selling stamps, be merely government agents, getting a fixed salary, and therefore, having no financial interest in amount of sales. If the baneful element of private profit could be eliminated the greater part of the liquor evil would disappear.

**WEDDING SURPRISES
LONDON SOCIETY**

London, Jan. 19.—Another society surprise has been given by the unexpected engagement of Viscount Chelsea to Miss Marie Coxon, a pretty girl of 21, and niece of Lady Jardine.
Viscount Chelsea last May passed through the bankruptcy court. He became bankrupt to the Earl of Cadogan and an income of \$50,000 yearly on the recent death of his seven year old nephew. Only a week ago Earl Cadogan, who is 70 years of age, married Countess Palagi, at Florence.
