Adelaide, S. Aus., Oct. 18.—During the last few years an area totaling millions of acres has been added to the previously recognized wheat-growing lands of South Australia.

Last season the wheaten hay and grain crop was valued at £5,410,005, and, as a result of the government's vigorous policy of development it is anticipated that within the next few years the area under wheat will be doubled.

P., said the ministry rejoiced in the continued prosperity of the state, and hoped, by prudent and progressive legislation and sound administration to enable the people to obtain the full advantages of the conditions that existed.
