## WRECKED SAILORS SAFE.

Seward, Alaska, June 17.—Stmr Dorra from Unalaska and Kodiak, reports by wireless that she has on board thirty-five shipwrecked sailors. No details are given as to ship they are from.

## LARGE STEAM SCHOONER.

A San Francisco firm has placed an order with Harlan & Hollingsworth, ship builders of Wilmington, Del., for a steam schooner capable of carrying 2,500,000 feet of lumber. She is intended for the coasting trade and for lumber carrying from the Pacific via the canal. This is the second vessel of the same size that the Wilmington firm has recently constructed to build for parties on the Pacific coast.

## NOVA SCOTIA LOBSTERS.

Portland, Me., June 17.—Four of the Portland lobster smacks, which have been doing business on the Nova Scotia coast this spring have made harbor here within the past two days, they having in their holds altogether about 21,000 live lobsters. The last one to arrive was the schooner Eva M. Martin, which came in late in the afternoon from Digby, N. S., with a 6,000 count. The season is now about over, although possibly one or two more trips from the provinces may be landed here later in the month.

## DANGERS TO NAVIGATION.

New York, June 16.—Stmr Magda (Nor), from Havana, reports June 14, off Five Fathom Bank Lightship, passed a spar showing 4 feet above water, with considerable wreckage about it, part of a vessel's hull, with bright copper showing; June 15, from 12 to 15 miles south of Ambrose Channel Lightship, passed a large quantity of spars, new timber and a lot of small lumber.

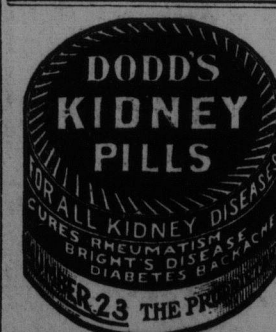
