Portland Argus: Although at this season of the year the first steamers coming here on the regular transatlantic schedules are about the leaving the other side, none have done so as yet, and no definite information of any kind can be obtained as to what steamers are coming or when they will sail from English ports. Although the first sailings from Portland on the regular schedules have in former years generally commenced about the 25th of November, it is practically certain there will be no sailings from here during the present month, and it is said the first boat of the White Star-Dominion Line will not take her departure from this port until the 9th of December.

BRITISH SHIPPING RULES.

In connection with the measures decided on by the British government in pursuance of its recent decision to ut. Itze shipping more effectively to meet the needs of the war, two orders in council were made public in London on Wednesday. The first prohibits British ships from carrying cargo from one foreign port to another foreign port of another foreign port after Dec. 1, unless licensed. The second gives power to requisition ships for the carriage of foodstuffs and necessaries. Regarding the first order the official statement says. "It is not expected that it will be necessary to interfere with established service between foreign ports," while the object of the second order, is to "prevent rates on foodstuffs and other cargoes from rising to a prohibitive level."

Few, however, had such a sensational carobrated horse Orme, which died a few weeks ago at the rare age of twenty-aix, and whose sire, Ormonde, was accounted the greatest racehorse of

During his racing career Orme wen 1232,528 in stakes for his owner, and would have won much more, but unportunately his career was marred by the act of a miscreant, who poisoned the horse while being trained for the two thousand guineas. The poisening of Orme was the sensation of 1892, and although a reward of £1,000 was offered for the discovery of the poisoners they were never detected.

Orme's dam, Angelica, was the full dister of another great racehorse, St. Simon, which belonged to the Duke of Or Portland, who bought the animal for the comparatively sman sum of 1600 guineas.
