Improvement in Trotters. The improvement in the trotters in the Maritime Provinces is illustrated by the recent meeting at the Halifax Exhibition. In 21 years ago this October when Israel, owned by A. C. Bell, New Glasgow, won the free-for-all from Gladstone Olive and Lucy Derrick in 2:34 1/4, 2:34, 2:28. In the last heat Meahan drove Israel for a record and he was the first horse to beat 2:30 over a Nova Scotia track. At the recent meeting Billy C. won the free-for-all in 2:16 1/4, 2:16, 2:15 1/4; during the seven days there were seventeen races, and in every one of which 2:30 was beaten, not only by aged horses, but by two and three-year-olds; Baron Cecil, a three-year-old, trotted in 2:24 3/4 in a race against aged horses while Barting's Comet, a two-year-old, trotted in 2:28 1/4, or only a quarter second slower than the mile made famous by Israel, Brazilian (the sire of Billy C.) was the champion 2-year-old that year, and trotted a mile at Halifax against time in 2:48 1/4. Parkside was the champion 3-year-old that year, and took a record of 2:24 at Charlotte town.
