Mrs. Kuhring Talks
About Red CrossTwenty First Annual Meeting
of the Provincial Chapter
of the I. O. D. E. Meeting.

Fredericton, April 18.—The twenty-first annual meeting of the Provincial Chapter of the Imperial Order of the Daughters of the Empire convened here this morning, with Mrs. W. J. Scott presiding, in the absence of the Provincial Regent, Mrs. R. Fitz-Randolph.

Mrs. G. C. Vanwart welcomed the delegates to the city on the occasion of the twenty-first anniversary of the founding of the Order in New Brunswick. She spoke of the great growth of the Order and said that a great deal of praise was due to the first Regent of the Provincial Chapter, Mrs. John Black.

Mrs. Kathleen Taylor, Provincial Secretary, read her report, which showed that there were now thirty primary chapters in New Brunswick. There are 1,055 members, but only 342 actually paid up. the Red Cross was trying to save the children and lessen infant mortality. It is her duty to instruct the mother in the care of the child and thus reduce the horrible condition.

Mrs. Kuhring urged all men, women and children to stand by this movement for education to take part in the big drive and support every movement for public health welfare. We have a public health department and it is up to us to see that they, the department, carry out her part and that all measures of prevention are carried out.
