2,092 BRITISH OFFICERS LOST IN LAST 2 WEEKS

Of These, 603 Were Killed, 1,396 Wounded and 93 Missing-Army of 41,017 Officers in Casualty List Since War Began - Nova Scotia Men Appear

London, Sept. 18—Officers casualty lists for the last fortnight of August contain the names of 603 officers killed, 1,396 wounded and 93 missing, a total of 2,092. This brings the losses of officers in the British army since the commencement of hostilities to 41,014 of whom 12,045 have been killed or died of wounds, 26,076 wounded and 2,893 missing.

During the fortnight Brigadier-General Potter was wounded, Brigadier-General Buckle killed and live lieutenant-colonels killed.
