Elopement, Murder and Suicice Death of a Devoteu Cou e.

PITTSBURG, PA., July 12. A terrible tragedy was enacted yesterday afternoon in the quiet, old-fashioned Dutch village of Harmony, some twentyfive miles distant from this city, accessible only by stage, and lacking telegraph connection with the outer world. The victims of this murder and suicide were Miss Kate Faulstech, a beautiful girl, aged seventeen, and John Frazier, a sober, industrious young fellow of about twenty-five years of age. Little less than a year ago the parties

resided with their respective parents, in adjoining houses, in the centre of Wheeling, W. V. Frazier was sober and was well thought of in the neighborhood, while Kate Faulstech was also of an excellent family and the pet of that household. An acquaintance between the two was struck up, which ripened into mutual affection for each other. The parents of Kate watched the progress of affairs and at a proper time slipped in and forbade Frazier to visit the house any more. The Frazier to visit the house any more. The lovers, however, arranged secret meetings, and, at length becoming convinced that the coursent of Kate's parents could that the coursent of Kate's parents could be a secret meeting of the course of Kate's parents could be a secret meeting of the course of Kate's parents could be a secret meeting of the course that the consent of Kate's parents could never be had to their union, the young pair resolved on eloping.

One dark night the girl left her happy home and started for this city with her

lover. The mother of the girl, on discovering the absence of her daughter, was convinced in her own mind that sne had run away. The telegraph was put in operation, and, according to instructions, the train was stopped and the two elopers captured near Stuebenville. They were brought back and the parents of the girl brought an action against Frazier on the charge of enticing their daughter from their home. They failed to make out a case owing to the fact that the girl would testify nothing damaging to her lover. Shortly afterward Frazier started to New York and from there came to this city, where he remained for some time, keep-ing up a secret correspondence with the object of his soul's affection. In answer object of his soul's anection. In answer to his request they arranged for another elopement. All necessary preparations were made and arrangements for depar-ture secretly to Wooster, Ohio, were care-

ture secretly to wooster, Omo, we carefully planned at this point.

Frazier met her according to agreement, and from there came to this city, where they lived as man and wife for some weeks. It is not known whether they were married or not; but it is presented they were as Frazier wrote to ned they were, as Frazier wrote to that effect to some friends in Wheeling from this city a few days ago. Yesterday John and Kate arrived there, and put up at a Drovers' Home, kept by Jas. Chauncy. Both were well dressed and shown to a room, where they spent the most of the day, and nothing particular was no-ticed either about their movements or conduct. In the evening the gentle-man asked the proprietor where a buggy could be hired. He thought he should like to take a drive, as the country seemed very beautiful: Accord-ingly a messenger was sent to hire a vehicle and in due time it was driven to

vehicle and in due time it was driven to the door of the hotel. Word was sent to the strangers, who, of course, were supposed to be man and wife, that the buggy was ready and waiting at the door. The couple, however, did not promptly come down stairs, and the proprietor waited patiently for his guests, thinking, perhaps, that the gentleman might need some instructions as to which road was best to drive along.

While thus waiting he was startled by hearing the report of a pistol from the room. Chauncey instantly ran up stairs, and was horrified to see a pistol shot wound in the young girl's forchead, from which the warm blood was slowly trickly a down her ashy nale face.

Kate staggered like a drunken woman and fell helplessly into the terrified land-lord's arms. He slowly descended the stairs with his burden, when he was again startled by a second report of a pistol. Half crazed with fright, he dropped the lying girl, and, rushing up stairs, found Frazier lying on the floor, writhing in the agonies of death, his face covered with blood and a bullet in his forehead. He was lifted into bed, but made no reply to questions put to him, medical assistance was summoned, and the doctors at once commenced to probe for the ball.
