AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE WOMEN'S HOME.

(Passed the 17th day of April, A. D. 1879.)

Be it enacted by the Governor, Council and Assembly, as follows:

- 1. Charlotte Stirling, Blanche Ann Sutherland, Mary Smith, Sarah McEwan, their associates and successors, members of the corporation hereby created, according to the rules and by-laws thereof, are hereby incorporated by the name of "The Women's Home," in connection with the Women's Christian Association, for the purpose of reclaiming and receiving into their asylumun fortunate and depraved women who have been tried at the Police Court, before the Stipendiary Magistrate, or the officer presiding.
- 2. The corporation may purchase, take, hold and enjoy, realestate to the value or sum of sixty thousand dollars, and may sell, mortgage, convey or otherwise dispose of the same.
- 3. The Directors for the time being of the "Women's Home" may from time to time, as they see fit, receive and keep any person or persons who may voluntarily wish to avail themselves of the advantage offered by such institution, but the terms of their admission, the length of time leaving, the charges and expenses attending their stay, their control, management and general conduct must be made as the said directors for the time being shall approve of and agree to; provided that all persons so admitted must observe, perform, keep and submit to the general rules and regulations for the management of said institution.
- 4. The "Women's Home" shall have power to make all such bylaws and rules as may be necessary for the management and conduct of such an institution, and for carrying out the objects of its iucorporation.
