"Church may be definitely enrolled as annual "subscribers to the Domestic and Foreign "Missionary Society."

REPORTS OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY. .

The reports of the Provincial Corresponding Secretary, the Provincial Dorcas Secretary, and the Provincial Treasurer of the Woman's Auxiliary were at this point read, and received.

At 6 p.m. the Board adjourned till 8 p.m.

EVENING SESSION.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON JAPANESE WORK.

On the reassembling of the Board, the Bishop of Ottawa presiding, the chairman presented on behalf of the Bishop of Quelec the report of the Committee on Japanese Work which, after consideration in detail and amendment, was adopted and ordered to be printed (250 copies), and copies to be sent to the Bishop of South Tokyo and the missionaries interested. On motion of the Rev. 7. C. Street Macklem,

On motion of the Rev. T. C. Street Macklem, seconded by the Dean of Montreal, it was resolved.

solved, "That this Board adopts the recommendation "of the report on Japanese Work as to taking "over the work in Japan, and hereby accepts "the proposal of the S.P.G. (made in response "to a communication from this Board), for "withdrawal therefrom."

Moved by the Dean of Montreal, seconded by Dr. Davidson, and resolved, "That the Secretary be instructed to express

"That Bishop Awdry be informed of the "action of the Board in regard to its work "in Japan, and that a certified copy of the "rules relating thereto this day adopted, be "forwarded to him at once by the Secretary."

TRAINING OF A JAPANESE NURSE.

On motion of Mr. Edw. J. B. Pense, seconded by Dr. R. Vashon Rogers, Q.C., it was resolved,

"That subject to the approval of Bishop "Awdry, the Board authorizes the General Trea-"surer to provide §150 towards the passage "from Japan to Kingston of Miss Hamaguche, "a probationary nurse, and that she be required "to enter into an agreement satisfactory to the "Bishop, to serve for a term of years after her "return to Japan; and that the Board also "authorizes him to provide \$150 more for her "return trip when she has completed her train-"ing course in Canada."

AMOUNT AVAILABLE FOR MISSION WORK IN IAPAN.

The General Secretary was instructed to inform the Bishop of South Tokyo, that next year \$4,500 will be available for mission work in the Canadian district of his diocese under the rules and regulations of the Board; and the Treasurer was requested to furnish the Secretary with a detailed statement of the disposition of the quarterly remittance.

APPLICANTS FOR WORK IN THE FOREIGN MIS-SION FIELD.

At this point the application of the Rev. R. H. McGinnis was considered, and his replies to the question paper of the Board, and the testimonials of his references were read. The Chairman stated that another priest had offered for work in Japan ; and the General Secretary also reported that application had been made in behalf of Miss Clara Thornton, supported by stong testimonials, and that peding her more complete preparation for work in Japan she was now engaged in missionary work at Battleford, N. W.T. Mc. McCinnis's application was referred to the Examining Committee of the Diocese or Niagara.

On motion of Dr. Davidson, seconded by Canon Spencer, it was resolved,
