## MES HRREI HROMIIR

Suffered By Henry Abraham and Fritz Black.

The Former Lost in a Blizzard for Three Days - Black's Feet Severely Frozen.

From Saturday's Dilly.
Last night reports were received in the city of the terrible hardships suffered by Henry
Black at White river. Behrens \& Abraham, who have an office in Dawson and who own anc operate a saw mill at the mouth of 14th-aiout two weeks ago-Mt. Abra ham left Dawson with six men. The party traveled up the river with a team and sled, which was loaded with Tnei pounds of tools and provisions. The Waw mill at White iver, and the men, among whom wa Fritz Black, were hired to do logging work. With the exception of one o the horses falling through the ice anc being rescued, there were no difficulties encountered on the trio from Dawson which was accomplished in four days. On the following Saturday-a week ago today-Abraham and Black left the saw mill camp with the team and sied They intended to go about two mile up white river in orde so sime hay for the horses. No provisions no blankets were taken, for the men ex pected to return in time for dinner Soon after they had departed a terrible blizzard arose. At noon neither Abraham nor Black had returned to camp and the five who were there becai anisus for the salety done, however during the aftern About $60^{\prime}$ 'clock the the Blate returned to camp. He had suffered severely from the fros and both feet were so badly trozen that it is doubtful if he will be able to avoid amputation. When able to recount his midfortunes, Black told how his companion and himself had heen his compato therm and had lost their reckoning : that he had left Abraham
and the team in order to look for the trail, and after searching a little while he was unable to find his wáy back to either Abraham or the entefit; that he had wandered aimlessly anlound, and by mere chance had succeefled in returning to the camp. One man was left in charge of Blick; and the remaining four went out to rescae their employer They searched in wain, and becoming exhausted the party returned to camp at $40^{\text {oclock }}$ Sunday morning. Three hours later two of the men started agan. They continued the search all day, but could diseover no trace of the lost man. In the evening, the other two men re sumed the work of attemipted rescue, but to no avail. Monday morning thes returned to camp weary and dis the previous day left camp determiner to continue the search, hut their effort. were unavailing. When they returner for their story of Abrabam was entertained
In'the meantime the storm had rage with unabated fury; but Monday even ing the wind subsided to some exten and the sky cleared.
While the party in camp were eating supper the door of the cabin cpened and Abraham staggered into the room. Strange to say, he was not seriously frozen, though for three davs and two nights he hat been driving aimlessly around, ant had not once experience the comfort of a shelter, or fire, or or everest blizzard of the season. His team hardly showed the effects of the deprivations which it had experienced.
Yesterday Abraham telegraphed to his partner in Dawson, Herry Behrens, for
