BILL for preserving, for the purposes of Husbandry, the Grass. growing on Beaches.

Preamble,

No person to allow their cattle &c. to stray upon beaches where grass grows, until such grass is cut and cured.

Penalty in case of default.

Proprietors of land may cut the grass upon the beaches opposite the same to the exclusion of all others.

THEREAS it is necessary to make provi-. sion to prevent the destruction of the grass growing on the River St. Lawrence, and its tributary streams, between high and low water marks, which grass, in many places sufficiently abundant to afford supplies of grass useful for the maintenance of cattle and other live stock during the winter season, is nevertheless for the most part rendered useless and lost by suffering cattle to run at large, trampling and grazing upon the same: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the Fourteenth Year of His Majesty's. Reign, intituled, ' An Act for making more effec-'tual provision for the Government of the Pro-'vince of Quebec, in North-America,' and to make further provision for the Government of said Province : And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that from and after the passing of this Act, and during its continuance, it shall not be lawful for any person to suffer his cattle or live stock of any description to stray or run at large between high and low water marks, in the summer or autumn, on any of the beaches. or strands within the tidewater of the River St. Lawrence, or any of its tributary streams, until the grass having grown thereupon, shall have been cut and cured, under the penalty of

for every animal so allowed to stray or run at large as aforesaid, in disobedience to this Act, and cattle or live stock found straying or running at large as aforesaid, shall be liable to be detained and disposed of in manner as provided by an Act or Ordinance of the Governor and Legislative Council of the late Province of *Quebec*, passed in the thirtieth year of the reign of His Majesty *George* the Third, intituled. "An Act or Ordinance for meventing

intituled, "An Act or Ordinance for preventing "cattle from going at large or l'abondon des "animaux."

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the proprietors or owners of the land bordering on the said river or any of the tributary streams, shall be entitled to cut and
