Was a mem. of the Vol. Militia Force for a number of years and was on active service five months during the Fenian troubles in 1866. Is Lieut. Col. of the Reserve Militia, Co. of Dundas. Was an unsuccessful candidate for present seat at g.e. 1886. First returned to Leg. Assem. 31 Jan., 1888, on the sitting mem., Dr. Chamberlain's election being declared void for bribery by agents. Re-elected at g.e. 1890. A Liberal Conservative.—Morrisburg.

WILLOUGHBY, WILLIAM ARSON, M.D. (East Northumberland.)

S. of Geo. H. Willoughby, who was a descendant of the Devonshire Willoughbys and a native of Irel., and came to Can. about 1838. B. in the Tp. of West Gwillimbury, Co. of Simcoe, 2 Feb., 1844. Ed. at the Bradford Grammar Sch., and graduated M.D. at Victoria Coll. in 1867. A mem. for eight years of the Colborne Municipal Council. and seven years its Reeve, and a member for nine years of the School Board. Was Warden of the United Counties of Northumberland and Durham in 1884. Is a surgeon of the 40th Batt. V. M. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g.e. 1886. Being unseated on petition, a new election took place 1 Feb., 1888 at which he was an unsuccessful candidate. On the death of the sitting mem. Mr. Clarke, a new election took place, 11 Oct. 1888, when he was re-elected. Reelected at last g.e. A Conservative.—Colborne, Ont.

Wood, Lieut.-Col. Alpheus Field, J.P. (North Hastings.)

S. of Thomas S. Wood, of Kingston, who served in the war of 1812. B. in Jefferson Co., N. Y., 30 May,
