An Act to amend the "Medical Act of Upper Canada."

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Medical Act of Upper Preamble.

 - 3. Of all penalties recovered under the thirty-fourth section of the Division of said Act, one half shall go to the prosecutor or the party laying the penalties. information.
