Barry King won the 100 and 440 titles, while John took the 220 championship and placed second in the 100. Both were instrumental in bringing their relay team to a second place in the 880.

The weather was ideal for a meet and the thrilling finishes and keen rivalry kept the crowd in excitement all day. U. N. B. amassed a total of 54\*

points, while St. F.X. of Antigonish, N. S., came second with 52. Acadia garnered 27 points for third place while Mount Allison and Dalhousie trailed with 16 and 6 points, respectively. Individual high scorer was a colorful all-rounder named Bernats, who came to Acadia from Europe on an exchange scholarship. 


