 Heard weekdays from 4:30 to 6:30 in Newfoundland and 4 to 6 in the Maritimes.

- Each contestant may submit one entry only.
- The song must be presented on cassette but does not have to be produced or arranged. It must be accompanied by a lyric sheet typed or legibly written on 8 x 10 paper. It will be judged on the basis of three criteria:
 A) lyrics
 B) melody
 C) originality.
- Entries must be received by, or postmarked no later than February 1, 1991. Entries should be sent to the CBC station nearest you. (See addresses on back).
- Songs must be original, and the legal property of the entrant. They must not have been previously recorded or published.
- The cassettes submitted will not be returned.
- The grand prize winner will have his/her song produced by CBC for broadcast purposes.
- CBC reserves the right to award no grand prize.
- CBC reserves the right to select the session musicians for the recording.
- CBC employees or members of their immediate family are not eligible.
- Preliminary judging will be performed at each location by a panel of judges under the direction of the afternoon show producer. Semi-finalists will be chosen proportionately from each location. These will be submitted for final judging by a panel of regional judges.
- Musicians who have had a broadcast recording with CBC in the Atlantic region during the last two years are not eligible.
- Contestants must have resided in the Atlantic Provinces for at least one year, and be currently residing here.
- The results of the competition will be announced on Mainstreet (On The Go in Newfoundland) March 4 - 8, 1991; 4:00 - 6:00 p.m.
- Winners must be available for interviews for promotional purposes with CBC and other media.

For more information on the CBC Atlantic Song Contest, tune in to your local CBC afternoon program.

The winner must be available for recording the week of March 25, 1991.

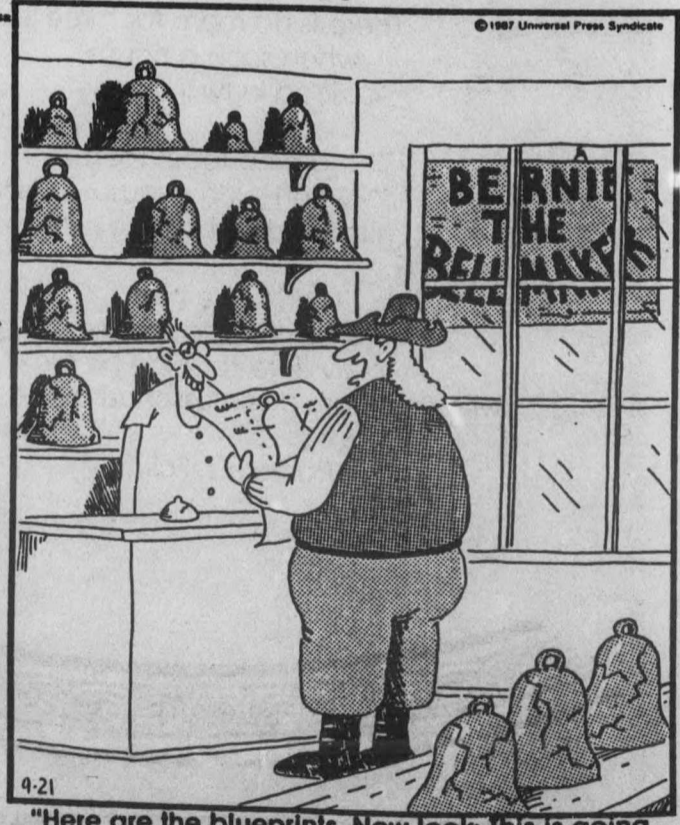
