

this, that rum is taken up to the head of the lake and to Port Erie at the Annual Delivery of presents, the quantity that is generally required for the head of the lake is Twenty four Gallons, and eight for Port Erie, without Kegs I should be obliged to take upon those occasions aboard to each place, there being nothing to contain a smaller quantity in store, from this statement it may perhaps appear to his Excellency that by allowing three or four Kegs to be made there will be a saving of thirty six or thirty eight gallons of rum upon the above delivery of presents.
