We are laboring persistently upon this mighty problem and have made a collection of many facts in this connection and are desirous of extending our lines far beyond those of organized labor, and and of its pupil in the United States, The Congressional Department of labor, but we have no endowment of any kind and cannot presecute this course on parellel lines with you, we can make recommendations
