Ottawa, 20th May, 1914.

Sir:-

In reply to your letter of the 12th instant, I beg to say that you may have the orphan child therein referred to (whose Grandmother is Mrs. Louis Bernard) placed in the Hotel Dieu Hospital, at Nicolet, where you say the child can be maintained and cared for at a cost of \$ 4.00 a month. You should forward to the Department an account for the expenses incurred in bringing the child to the hospital, and you should submit, monthly, in future, accounts for maintenance.

With regard to Widow Louis Bernard, I beg to say that if she is able to provide for herself you should not furnish her with any assistance, but if she needs a small amount of aid you may assist her for a short time.
