cost of his attendance during May and Jume, so that the expenditure is decidedly on the increase. You will observe that only three patients were treated by the Doctor during July.

It is considered that the cost of medical service is
too high, and therefore I shall be glad to receive a recommendation
from you in this matter. Be good enough to state whether you would
recommend placing the Doctor on salary. If so, you should state
the amount of salary and also mention the reserves at which the
Doctor should attend in return for a fixed rate of payment.
Copy of Agent Sibbald's letter of the 9th August, and
copy of the doctor's letter of the 31st July relative to the July

account are enclosed herewith.
