- A. To Cornwall training centre.
- . For your basic training?
- A. Yes sir.
- How long were you there?
- A. Two months sir.
- Q. Where did you go from Cornwall, Ontario?
- A. To Camp Ipperwash.
- Q. For your advanced training?
- A. Yes sir.
- . When did you join the Brockville Rifles?
- A. I don't know the date sir.
- Q. Well just an idea.
- A. It was May, I think, I am not sure.
- Q. In May, 1944?
- A. Yes sir.
- Q. Where did you join the Brockville Rifles at?
- A. At Aldershot, Nova Scotia.
