

7. *The Bursar* has charge of the accounts of the University.
8. *The Librarian* is the administrative officer in charge of the Library.

Officers of Instruction

1. *A Professor* is a permanent member of the teaching staff of the highest grade.
2. *An Assistant Professor* is a member of the teaching staff, appointed permanently or for a period of years.
3. *A Lecturer* is a teacher giving but part of his time to University work.
4. *An Instructor* is a member of the teaching staff, appointed from year to year.
5. *A Demonstrator* is an instructor giving instruction in subjects requiring laboratory work.

Academic Groups

- A College* is a body of teachers and students engaged in work leading to a degree (or to related degrees.)
- A School* is a division of a college organized for a specific purpose, such as the School of Domestic Science.
- A Department* is a group of teachers in one subject, such as English, or in related subjects, such as Modern Languages.
- A Class* is the unit of instruction given in any department, and may be indicated as English 1, English 2, etc.
- A Course* is a group of classes combined for any purpose.
- A Curriculum* is a course leading to a degree.
- A General Course* or curriculum leading to the B.A. or B.Sc. degree is designed to give the student a broad yet thorough training in the leading subjects of the liberal arts and sciences.
- A Special Course* permits students in the third and fourth years to specialize in one or more departments.
- A Degree with Distinction* is awarded to students who attain a high standing in the general course.
- A Degree with Honours* is awarded to students who attain a standing in a special course.
