TOWNSHIP OF ANCASTER.

Settlements were made in this Township as early as the year 1790. In 1812 Ancaster had become a thriving village, and at the conclusion of the war immigrants arrived in great numbers, and the prosperity of the township has steadily increased from that time.

The following families were among the earliest settlers in this township: S Hall, who built a mill and a distillery and kept the first store; Horning, Smith, Crooks, Lawson, Sharp, Cope, Drake Jones, Tisdale, Wilson, Ashbaugh, Cline, Peer, Berkley, Vansickle, Vanderlip, Munn's, Howell, etc. The number of acres assessed, (1869) 45,688; the population 4,206—See village of Ancaster.
