our own Church, both in Foreign and Home Mission fields, but also in practical benevolence towards the deserving poor in our more immediate vicinity—at the same time we have not forgotten persecuted Armenia or plague stricken India.

We have endeavoured each year to add something to our programme of School work, and it is not unlikely that, during the early part of the incoming year, your attention will be directed to a Home Department in connection with our Sunday School.

In resigning the position of Superintendent, which I have been honoured with for the last eight years, I desire to thank you for your uniform, loyal and enthusiastic support of our Sunday School during that period; and I sincerely hope that your interest will continue to be an ever-increasing one in this—one of the most important departments of our Church work.

We all, as teachers, pupils and officers, wish you a very happy New Year.
