In the out-door department there is a daily attendance of between 60 and 70 patients, which affords excellent instruction in Minor Surgery, routine medical practice, and Diseases of Children. The Eye and Ear Department will afford to the student an opportunity of studying practically, under skilled direction, these important branches. At the University Dispensary there will be Demonstrations on Gynæcology, on Diseases of Children, and on Diseases of the Skin.
