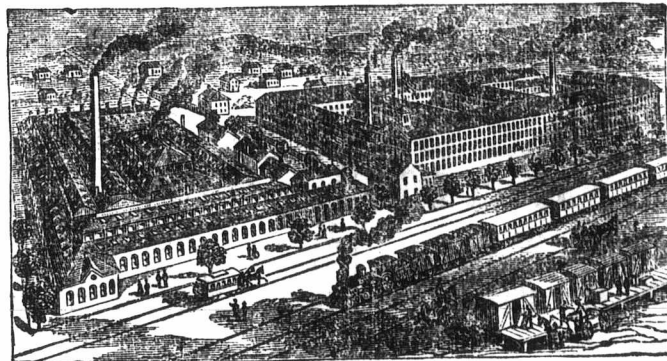

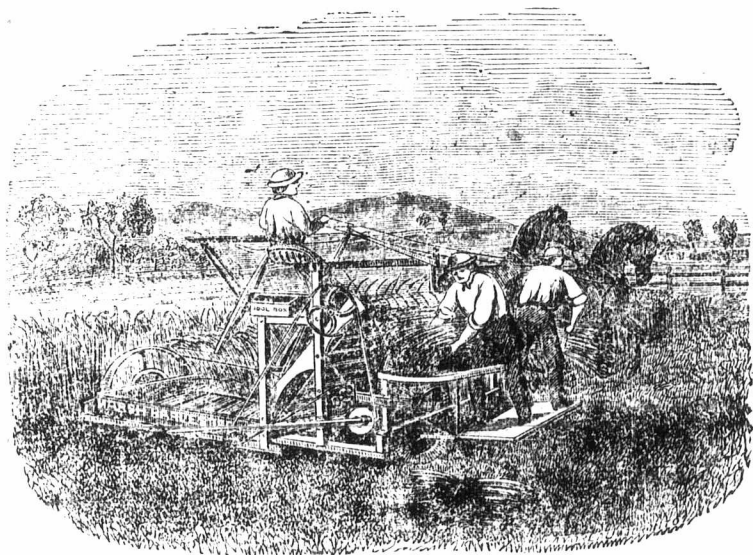
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WARRANTY.—The Marsh Harvester is warranted to be of light draft, and to cut Grain in a workman-like manner—equal to the work done by any other Reaper.

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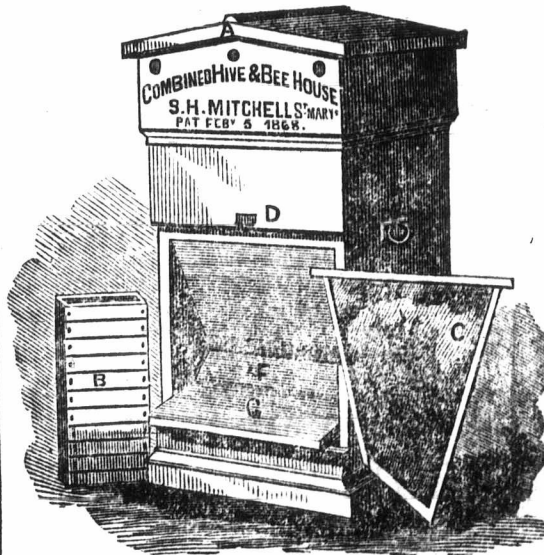
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
