He is sired by Brightest ary, whose dam and grandam's records average: Milk, 85.3 lbs. in one day, and butter, 27.36 lbs. in seven days The dam of Choicest Canary is Nanuet Topsy Clothilde, with a record of 30.18 lbs. in seven days, and a butter-fat test of 4.18 per cent. This is one of the richest-fred young bulls in Canada, and should make good on this great herd. The high-class character of this herd. both as official producers and as a show herd, are too well known to need any particularizing.
