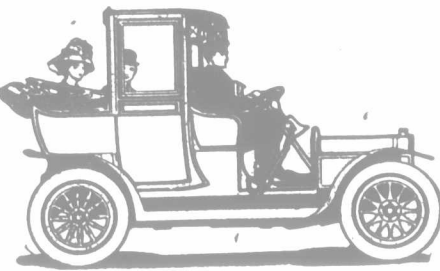

GOSSIP.

HOLSTEINS BY AUCTION.

In the town of Hespeler, within five minutes' walk of the G. T. R. station from Guelph on the north, and Brantford on the south; also the electric-line station from Waterloo, Berlin, Preston, Galt, Paris and Brantford, on Thursday, December 23rd, thus taking advantage of the holiday rates, D. Rife & Sons will sell by auction their entire herd of forty head of high-class Holstein cattle; twenty of them are cows and heifers in milk, ten of which have calves at foot. With the exception of half a dozen, all of them are young. There are five two-year-old heifers, seven yearling heifers, and six heifer calves, four bull calves and one yearling bull; also the stock bull, Count Calamity Mercedes, sire of the champion two-year-old heifer of Canada, with a seven-day butter-record of 20 lbs., and a milk record of 434 lbs. for seven days and 63 lbs. for 1 day. He is also sire of the two highest-testing two-year-old heifers in Canada. Their 7-day butter records average 18.69 lbs., and 1-day milk 60 lbs. This bull is sired by Count Calamity Wayne, whose dam, Lady Wayne Lorne, has a record of 22 lbs., and his own dam, Queen Pieterje Mercedes, has a four-year-old record of 23.58 lbs. for seven days, of butter, and 448.02 lbs. of milk, and her dam's record is 18.59 lbs. Everything of breeding age will be in calf to this bull. A number of the cows have official records ranging from 12 lbs. to 22 lbs. This is a genuine dispersion sale, and includes the horses, implements, pure-bred White Rock and Buff Orpington poultry, etc. The terms are: Ten months on bankable paper, with 6 per cent. interest. MAPLE HILL HOLSTEINS AND STANDARD-BREDS.

The great Maple Hill show herd of Record-of-merit Holsteins, the property of G. W. Clemens & Son, of St. George, Ont., were found in good condition when visited by "The Farmer's Advocate" wanderer a few days ago. The most richly-bred stock bull, Prince Posch Pieterje C., is a grandson of the renowned Calamity Jane, three years winner of the dairy test at Guelph, whose official record of a little over 24 lbs. in seven days created such a sensation at the time. The dam of this bull is the world-famed Boutsje Q. Pieterje De Kol, the O. A. C. cow which gave in one year 20,778 lbs. of milk that produced 912 lbs. of butter on an 85-per-cent. basis, and this as a three-year-old. As proof of his progeny as a sire, we have only to add that at the late Toronto Exhibition, his heifers won first, third and fourth in the senior-heifer class in a ring of 12. As future stock bull, the promising young bull, Choicest Canary, bids fair to develop into something away above the average. He is sired by Brightest Canary, whose dam and granddam's records average: Milk, 85.3 lbs. in one day, and butter, 27.36 lbs. in seven days. The dam of Choicest Canary is Nanuet Topsy Clothide, with a record of 30.18 lbs. in seven days, and a butter-fat test of 4.18 per cent. This is one of the richest-red young bulls in Canada, and should make good on this great herd. The high-class character of this herd, both as official producers and as a show herd, are too well known to need any particularizing. Their unqualified successes in the show-ring at Toronto, and the dairy test at Guelph, put them on their proper level as one of the best herds in the country, and their large official milk-and-butter records show their capabilities as producers. There are still for sale two or three bull calves and a few heifers. Mr. Clemens, Jr., is an enthusiastic admirer of Standard-bred horses, of which he has several very choice representatives, among them being three daughters of the great Magrazia, Miss Wilks' champion of two flags. Two of them are yearlings, and the other a weanling. All are bays, and, as Mr. Clemens is not breeding for fun, these choice youngsters can be bought. Also for sale is a two-year-old Hackney stallion, a chestnut, by Imp. Commodore 3rd, dam by the Madison Square Garden champion, Robin Adair. This is a big, smooth, growthy colt, well broken to harness, and can be bought well worth the money.
