FIGHT IS BEGUN OVER C. N. R. BILLS

Sir Adam Beck Made a Vigorous Speech in Favor of Hydro-Radial.

Ottawa, March 24.—The C. N. R. bills were before the Parliamentary Railway Committee yesterday, and after considerable discussion their further consideration was postponed until next Tuesday morning. Sir Adam Beck, in the course of the session, made a clear and vigorous address on behalf of the Hydro-radial movement in Ontario, and against the bills. He contended that if the bills were passed a restriction should at least be included that construction should not be begun until an order-in-Council had been signed by the Governor-General.

THE BILLS

The two bills were considered jointly. The Niagara St. Catharines and Toronto bill, as proposed to be amended, related to lines from Fort Colborne to Fort Erie and on to Niagara Falls, with another line from the Falls to the town of Niagara, and from Welland to Brantford, and an extension of the line of the St. Catharines and Niagara Central to Fort Erie. The company agreed to eliminate the bill which would allow the electric trolley to be used for the purposes of the railway. The Toronto, Niagara and Western bill asked extension of time for the line from Toronto to Windsor, via Hamilton, Brantford and London, with a line from Hamilton to St. Catharines.

Sir Adam Beck, W. W. Pope and F. A. Gaby appeared for the Hydro-Electric interests, R. G. Code, K.C., for the Ontario Government, City Solicitor Johnson, Commissioner Harris, Controller Cameron and Ald. Hiltz for the city of Toronto, Mayor D. B. Hanna and Gerard Fuel for the Canadian Northern interests.

FORTY-FIVE AUTOS IN EGYPTIAN RAID

Further Particulars of Rescue of British Prisoners From Senussi Tribesmen.

London, March 24.—The War Office last night made public the following official communication: "A further report has been received from Egypt regarding the liberation of 91 prisoners who were in the hands of the Senussi tribesmen. The rescue expedition, which was entirely separate from the action of March 14 (when the British captured Sollum) took place March 17.

"Nine armored cars, twenty-six other cars and ten motor ambulances left Sollum at 3 o'clock in the morning. The British and Senussi forces were said to be at Bir-Hakim, 70 miles from Sollum, but the actual distance travelled was about 121 miles. "At the approach of the cars the guards fled, but they were pursued and killed. All the cars returned safely, bringing back the prisoners, who are being cared for in the hospital. Their condition is reported as satisfactory. Only two prisoners remain in the hands of the enemy, and there is some hope that they may be rescued."

A despatch from London March 18 reported that an armed car section under the command of the Duke of Westminster had rescued 25 miles west of Sollum ninety shipwrecked sailors who had landed on the Cyrenaica coast and been seized by the Senussi. The above communication probably refers to this incident.


