MANY LIVES ARE LOST IN BOHEMIA

Great Destruction Wrought There By Bursting of a Large Dam.

By Courier Leased Wire.
London, Sept. 19.—Many lives have been lost and enormous damage has been caused near Gablonz, Bohemia, by the bursting of a dam in the valley at Weissendesse, according to despatch to Reuters from Amsterdam, quoting a telegram received there from Gablonz.

The dam was eight meters in length and twenty in depth. The on-rushing water carried away numerous glass polishing factories, and it is feared that there are many victims. The bridges were not destroyed, but are in danger of collapse. The danger is very great. The villages of Teezendorf, Tiefenbach, Tauswald, Schumrowitz, and Grosshammer and Haratz are inundated. Ten bodies of victims have been recovered and identified.

GERMANS MAKE EFFORTS TO LINE UP

Attacks Endure Three Miles Bouchavesnes
By Courier Leased Wire.
New York, Sept. 21.—The correspondents of The Tribune last night, says:
As if to disprove the statement that their counter assaults have their elan, the Germans made separate effort to-day to regain hold on the Veronne-Buquain. A series of terrific rushes were led against the French and the fish lines, but they made no way.

The blows began last night on sides of the river, but they were no success. On the French the Germans penetrated some treble but Foch's troops drove them short order. This apparently preliminary work—an attempt to regain possession of those positions.

With morning a greater effort begun. This attack was confined to the French front in the sector between Rancourt and Clary. It was in Galletta, the Kaiser's troops the French a week ago. This gap it is possible for the troops to drive a wedge between two towns.

From 9 o'clock in the morning till midnight, the attack continued with fury along a three-mile front. Moving forward in dense masses the Russians assailed the Kaiser's troops themselves repeated Foch's positions. Wave after wave broke under the intense fire.

Von Tirpitz Berlin,

Is Accused of Deceiving Congress.

Berlin, Sept. 20, via London, 21, (T239) p.m.—Renewed and discussion in the Reichstag of submarine issue and the controversy, which led to the retirement of Admiral Von Tirpitz as minister the navy, appears to be inevitable consequence of the publication yesterday of the letters exchanged between Chancellor Von Bethmann-Hollweg and the admiral.

These letters the public learned in a private conversation Prof. Valentin asserted Admiral Von Tirpitz has misled the Reichstag as to the number of available submarines and the possibility of a marine campaign. The admiral mandated that the chancellor of the line Prof. Valentin, but the charges took the position the professor was not subject to disciplinary powers.

These letters, however, do not only the fringes of accusations allegation which for months been circulating from month to month in connection with this controversy. There is attributed Prof. Valentin not only the statement that Admiral Von Tirpitz misled the Reichstag regarding the previous success of submarine campaign and the amount of tonnage destroyed and that Foreign Office obtained the figures only from the papers sent from the admiralty.

This account of Prof. Valentin conversation not only reached Admiral Von Tirpitz, but was submitted the form of an affidavit to the arian war ministry and formed the subject of discussion in the Reichstag last month by King of Bavaria to a delegate which demanded a change in the
