2. Writing pad and envelopes; fancy post cards; short story.

3. Cigarettes; tobacco.

4. Candies; chewing gum; maple sugar.

5. Handkerchiefs; necktie; socks.

6. Game; book; puzzle; mouth organ.

7. Toilet requisites such as soap; toilet powder; tooth paste; pin cushion.

8. Packet of raisins; dates or figs, nuts.

9. Cake small or that can be cut.

10. Money to purchase any of the above.

All contributions should be handed in to the rooms here as soon as possible or not later than Sept. 26th.
