A Turkish corps has appeared , summit of Mount Tekke yeasterday ruing. From formidable entreached sittons on the hillside it attacked the arth regiment of Evzones about nidy. The latter made a strong resiste, but were finally compelled to fall

The Turks then cannonated and stroyed the village of Ordskoni, which is about two hours' march north of Pharsalos. The Crown Prince having ordered the entire army to draw up in line of battle, the Greeks advanced about 2 pm. The Turks, numbering 30,000, immediately descended the slopes of Mount Tekke and planted batteries, which began to bombard the Greek regiments. Owing to the superiority of weight the Turkish cannon inflicted heavy losses upon the Greeks, especially near the station.

"The Turks continued to advance until they came into close quarters and then the Crown Prince decided to retire to more commanding positions.
"All the ammunition and supplies have been transported to Domokos, on the heights of which the Greek batter." The Turks have burned the village of Tatari, and they have massacred a priest and an entire family in the village of Dioskani."
